BISHOP MALESIC'S FAREWELL After much prayer, deliberation and consultation from many leaders in the Diocese of Greensburg, Bishop Malesic has decided that his public farewell to the Diocese will be virtual in an effort to prioritize the health and safety of the entire community. To that end, Bishop Malesic's farewell Mass will be live streamed from Blessed Sacrament Cathedral on Sunday, August 30, 2020 at 3:00 PM. The Mass will be available for viewing on the Diocesan website: www.dioceseofgreensburg.org, the Diocesan Facebook Page and the Diocesan YouTube channel. Even though this event will be his public goodbye, and in-person attendance will be scaled back considerably given the current restrictions due to the COVID-19 pandemic, there will be opportunities to engage in the farewell. You will be able to send farewell messages to Bishop Malesic at: www.dioceseofgreensburg.org/bishopfarewell. Visitors to the site are able to submit a typed message, upload up to three photos or submit a video link. By submitting the material, you agree that your image and information can be used in any and all Diocesan communications. All material will be collected and presented to Bishop Malesic upon his departure to Cleveland. Bishop Malesic will be installed as the 12th Bishop of Cleveland at a Mass on Monday, September 14, 2020 at 2:00 PM at Saint John the Evangelist Cathedral in Cleveland. SAINT PIUS X (1835-1914)

Presidential vetoes we understand. But imagine vetoing a papal election! Yet in the conclave of 1903, the Archbishop of Cracow (ironically, a predecessor in that office of Karol Wojtyla, the future John Paul II) vetoed the leading candidate on the order of the Austro-Hungarian emperor. Instead, the cardinals elected Giuseppe Sarto of Venice as Pius X, the first pope, after a succession of nobles and diplomats, to hail from humble origins. Nor did the papacy alter his endearing simplicity. Tailors eventually made his cassock cuffs detachable because he absentmindedly wiped his fountain pen on them, forgetting that his old black cassock had been replaced by papal white! Taking as his motto “To restore all things in Christ” (Ephesians 1:10), Pius condemned the theological innovations called “modernism,” yet dramatically altered the then-common practice whereby people rarely received Communion for fear of unworthiness, mandating early First Communion and urging everyone to frequent reception. Refusing to bless troops assembled in Saint Peter’s Square—“I bless peace, not war!”—he died brokenhearted as World War I engulfed Christian Europe despite his peacemaking efforts.
