**UPDATE ON OUR PARISH PLANS** *First and foremost, I would like to thank the many of you who have responded to my recent request for increased financial assistance as we continue to deal with the uncertainties of this period. I am so grateful, and even a little astounded by how many of you responded so quickly and generously in support of our beautiful parish. Also, I would like to inform you of one way in which we as a community are moving forward to supplement our decreased income. Beginning in January 2021 Saint Bartholomew will be offering a weekly take-out meal! I have already met with diocesan leaders and a team is currently being formed. Our plan is to choose a date, likely Tuesday or Friday, which does not interfere with the operations of local organizations that are also offering weekly take-out meals. Two selections will be available at a cost of \$10 each: entree, side(s) and dessert. Potential volunteers need not be concerned that they may be tied up every week for the unforeseeable future. We already have enough volunteers for at least three weeks of teams. Anyone else who would like to participate, please contact the parish office. The amount of time we have before operations start allows us to plan and set up. This program is possible due to the generosity of the Crabtree Volunteer Fire Department! Because our Parish's kitchen facilities are not up to code for such an endeavor, we were at a loss as how to proceed with plans. That is when an unsolicited member of the Crabtree VFD recommend that we operate in their facility and sell our meals from there as well! The proposal was swiftly presented to their board and now we are able to continue with these endeavors. A huge shout out to the Crabtree Volunteer Department! Once again they have shown that their commitment to protection of our lives and properties goes far beyond expectations! Be on the look out for more information on fundraising opportunities, and please let us know if you have any ideas or questions!*

**SAINT ROSE PHILIPPINE DUCHESNE**

**November 18**

Pope Benedict once declared himself struck by how remarkably diverse our American saints are—some native born: Mother Seton, Katherine Drexel, Kateri Tekakwitha; most, like many Catholics today, immigrants: Padre Serra, Bishop Neumann, Mother Cabrini, Rose Philippine Duchesne. When the French Revolution that dispersed her convent ended, Rose joined the Religious of the Sacred Heart, volunteering for their United States mission, opening the first free school west of the Mississippi. Only after lengthy service as Superior did Rose—now seventy-one—realize her life’s dream, undertaking a mission among the Potawatomi Indians. When some worried about her advanced age and failing health, the Jesuit mission leader overruled them: “She must come! She may not be able to do much work, but she’ll bring the mission success by praying for us!” Frustrated by her inability to learn their languages, Rose nevertheless “spoke” to the Native Americans by her prayerful presence before the tabernacle. “Quah-kah-kanum-ad,” they named her, “Woman-Who-Prays-Always”—their way of bestowing the title the Church would later make official: saint!
