**UPDATE ON OUR PARISH PLANS** *First and foremost, I would like to thank the many of you who have responded to my recent request for increased financial assistance as we continue to deal with the uncertainties of this period. I am so grateful, and even a little astounded by how many of you responded so quickly and generously in support of our beautiful parish. Also, I would like to inform you of one way in which we as a community are moving forward to supplement our decreased income. Beginning in January 2021 Saint Bartholomew will be offering a weekly take-out meal! I have already met with diocesan leaders and a team is currently being formed. Our plan is to choose a date, likely Tuesday or Friday, which does not interfere with the operations of local organizations that are also offering weekly take-out meals. Two selections will be available at a cost of \$10 each: entree, side(s) and dessert. Potential volunteers need not be concerned that they may be tied up every week for the unforeseeable future. We already have enough volunteers for at least three weeks of teams. Anyone else who would like to participate, please contact the parish office. The amount of time we have before operations start allows us to plan and set up. This program is possible due to the generosity of the Crabtree Volunteer Fire Department! Because our Parish's kitchen facilities are not up to code for such an endeavor, we were at a loss as how to proceed with plans. That is when an unsolicited member of the Crabtree VFD recommend that we operate in their facility and sell our meals from there as well! The proposal was swiftly presented to their board and now we are able to continue with these endeavors. A huge shout out to the Crabtree Volunteer Department! Once again they have shown that their commitment to protection of our lives and properties goes far beyond expectations! Be on the look out for more information on fundraising opportunities, and please let us know if you have any ideas or questions!*

**SAINT FRANCES XAVIER CABRINI  
(1850-1917)**

**November 13**

Burly longshoremen glared at the woman in widow’s dress who interrupted their drinking to beg money, in broken English, for her orphanage. The bar exploded in laughter as one man responded by spitting in her face. “That was for me,” the woman smiled. “Do you have anything for the children?” Given today’s national debate, could it be as much God’s sense of humor as God’s will for our sanctification that our first American saint should be an immigrant and naturalized citizen? Frances Cabrini, adopting the name Xavier, confided to Pope Leo XIII her longing to follow her Jesuit patron to Asia. But the Pope replied, “Not East—*West!*” So she and her Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart exchanged exotic dreams of China for the impoverished reality of Italian ghettos across the United States and Central and South America. Before her death, Frances had founded seventy educational, health care, child, and family service institutions. Today, from Siberia to Ethiopia, in sixteen countries, Mother Cabrini’s sisters and lay associates embody her practical spirituality: “Let’s get to work! We’ll have eternity to rest!”
